THE FUTURE OF MEDICINE.

The future of medicine is already here. As technology continues to advance at an ever-increasing pace, scientists are working hard to make use of the inventions and systems being developed. Often, great ideas are developed by accident and at other times, after years of dedicated studies. One great discovery which could save millions of lives is a gel which can stop bleeding. It uses a natural substance which can help cells in the body grow together. Spare-part technology will probably also be par for the course in the near future as scientists are finding more and more ways of reproducing human tissue outside the body. The science of this is now moving to a cellular level and it will soon be possible to create specific cells. 3D printers have been around for quite a while, but scientists at Washington State University have developed a very special material to be used in these printers which has the same properties as human bone. This means that if you break an arm or a leg, for example, they will be able to create a bone which can be implanted while the real bone grows successfully around it. The artificial bone would then disintegrate.
